HOW'S YOUR CATHOLIC VOCABULARY?

Ambo The stand from which the Word of God is proclaimed.

Sedalia The priest's chair.

<u>Paten</u> A plate for bread consecrated at mass.

<u>Ciborium</u> A vessel for holding the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle.

Acolytes: Candles carried in procession to honor the crucifix.

Thurible: A portable container for burning incense.

<u>Alb:</u> The white robe worn by the priest in the sanctuary.

Cincture: The rope/cord worn around the waist of the priest or deacon. **Stole**: A scarf-life band of cloth (*priests and bishops wear them straight from the shoulders*;

deacons wear them diagonally across the chest).

Miter: A pointed head-dress worn by the bishop (a sign of teacher and shepherd).

<u>Crozier</u>: The shepherd's staff carried by a Bishop (sign of governance and pastoral concern for the people

of God entrusted to his leadership).

<u>Chasuble</u>: Chasubles and stoles are colorful outward garments worn by a priest as follows:

WHITE for Easter season (7 weeks); Christmas season (3 weeks); Feasts of the Church; funerals; baptisms; marriages; penance. VIOLET/PURPLE: 4 weeks of Advent; 6 weeks of Lent; penance; funerals.

GREEN; Ordinary Time. **RED**: Palm Sunday; Commemoration of the Lord's Passion; Pentecost;

Confirmation; Martyrs. BLACK: Funerals
